



"Touji", The Winter Solstice



"Touji", the winter solstice, falls around December 21st in the Northern Hemisphere. It is the day with the fewest hours of daylight in the year.

We have customs for the day, taking a *yuzu*-bath and eating pumpkin.

Yuzu is a yellow citrus fruit. We float them in a bathtub. A *yuzu*-bath warms up the body and soothes dry skin caused by the cold of winter.

It is said that a *yuzu*-bath has effects to alleviate backache, neuralgia and fatigue, improves blood flow and helps reduce stress, etc.

In addition, taking a *yuzu*-bath is said to ward off bad luck and bring good luck. Also, they say that *yuzu* trees are strong against diseases and have a long life.

People take a *yuzu*-bath for these reasons. This custom began in the Edo period (1603-1868).

Eating pumpkin on the winter solstice is a part of praying for disease prevention and good luck.

The winter season has fewer vegetables, but many pumpkins are harvested in Japan.

Pumpkins are rich in nutrients that ward off illness. People eat the dish made from boiled pumpkins on the day.
